It usually affects both parotid glands, so the swelling is on both sides of your face; however, in some cases it is just one-sided.

The most common causes of acute salivary gland infections are bacteria, especially Staphylococcus aureus, or staph. Viruses and fungi can also cause infection in the glands. (Mumps is an example of a viral infection of the parotid glands.) The infection is more likely to happen when the mouth is dry, due to:

Tumors: Tumors usually appear as painless enlargements in one of the salivary glands.
